Forest Schools

Early Years

At Kentmere Forest school sessions help children to develop in all the areas of learning in the EYFS curriculum.

The main skills learned help to develop children's Personal, Emotional and Social Development (PSED) and their knowledge in the Understanding of the World (UofW).

Throughout EYFS sessions the children will:

- Develop skills such as, confidence, imagination, creativity, curiosity, empathy, communication, teamwork, independence, develop both fine and gross motor skills, build self-esteem, self-motivation, take risks, perseverance, patience, focus, follow instructions, rules, connect with nature, be able use all their senses, express their feelings etc
- Be able to talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects.
- Have an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time.
- Show care and concern for living things and their environment
- Be able to talk about similarities, differences, patterns and change.
- Learn how to create a den, build a shelter, tie simple knots, following rules around the fire circle and fire pit, dangers of fires, how to use and store tools safely, such as, a peeler, palm drill, secateurs, also identify poisonous plants and that can cause harm.
