Science How can Parents Help?



Science is all around us and children are constantly observing their surroundings. Help your children make sense of the world around them by showing them science phenomena that occur in everyday activities. Be it outdoors or indoors, draw their attention to objects or things happening around them to trigger their curiosity and encourage them to explore.

Sometimes, we may encounter challenging questions that you do not have an answer to. Don't be worried or afraid, we don't have to be a walking encyclopaedia to guide our children. Invite them to learn together. For example, you could say, "That's an interesting question. Let's find out together!" Acknowledge your children's efforts in asking questions and guide them as they look for an answer. Try to make use of the library.
