



Kentmere Academy and Nursery Sports Premium Expenditure 2017/18

PE and Sport Premium was introduced in 2013 and its funding is received in schools annually, including academies. Schools received PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of children in years 1-6.

Sport Premium (SP) is additional to main school funding and is used by school in a variety of ways to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and Sporting opportunities.

The following report provides a summary of how Sport Premium has been allocated for the coming academic year (2017/18).
