Curriculum

The importance of getting solid foundations in place early in a child's education cannot be underestimated. Kentmere Academy and Nursery takes children from Nursery to Year 6 and develops them in classes where teachers have the time and resources to ensure that everyone achieves their potential. Our aim is to develop personal, social and academic confidence in each child. It is this close, individual focus that is the key to the highly successful education we provide.

Ofsted highlighted that our teachers are committed and skilled, supported well by enthusiastic teaching assistants, with no time wasted in lessons. They praised our teachers for demonstrating strong subject knowledge across the curriculum and for capturing pupils' attention and interest. They commented on how our pupils learn in different ways and our teachers ensure their needs are planned for in each lesson so that every child succeeds.

Early Years Foundation Stage: Nursery and Reception Classes

Nursery and Reception classes follow the statutory framework for Early Years.

The focus is on developing children's learning and independence across the following areas:

- Children have the opportunity to engage in indoor and outdoor learning.

Enrichment

We know that our extra-curricular clubs make us unique. Pupils from Reception to Year 6 are encouraged to choose the clubs and activities that they wish to take part in, they can choose as many as they like and they are FREE. We take pride in providing an active and healthy lifestyle for our pupils, in addition to our academic efforts.

Our pupils use the local swimming pool. Children will learn how to swim, develop their confidence in the water and take part in fun activities in the pool.

Our Sports Crew lead sport and PE and take control of the pupil voice in school. The Sports Crew organise and officiate sports and events, and collect opinions from pupils within the school to improve and tailor sporting provision.

We also have a number of pupil groups including, Digital Leaders, Prefect Council, Eco Council, Pro-Social Ambassadors and a School Council.

Pastoral Care

Prosocial

Kentmere Academy and Nursery has a Prosocial Policy that is designed to create a safe and secure environment with an atmosphere of mutual trust where everyone feels comfortable and is able to work to their full potential. We ensure that all members of the school are made aware of their responsibilities in creating a bully-free environment and that bullying in any form will not be tolerated. This issue forms a part of the PSHE and assembly programmes for all classes.

Each half term, we have a 'Sunshine Day' to focus on being kind and respectful to each other. The children learn about how we can get along better and to have zero tolerance to any form of bullying. During the day each class will have themed lessons around relationships and tricky situations. We invite everyone to wear yellow.

Safeguarding

It is our moral and statutory responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all pupils. We have a designated team for Safeguarding that is displayed around the school. If you wish to discuss anything relating to Safeguarding please do not hesitate to contact any member of the team.

Assemblies

All pupils attend and participate in our assemblies. Particular themes and issues are addressed through these and they provide an important meeting time for all pupils and staff to gather together to foster and encourage the development of all pupils.

Parents are invited into assembly to see their child collect any awards and hear all about the work we have been doing each term.

Head Pupil and Prefects

Each year children are chosen to be Head Prefects. They are supported by a number of Prefects and together they are responsible for assisting the teachers in a number of day-to-day routine tasks, welcoming visitors to the school and, most importantly, setting a good example to other pupils in the school.

Healthy Snack Shop

The children have created a Healthy Snack Shop that is open at break time. All Key Stage 2 (Year 3-6) can purchase a drink, piece of fruit or healthy snack.

Rewards

A culture of praise and encouragement in every aspect of school life is of paramount importance to every pupil's development, both academic and pastoral. Accordingly, merits are awarded for excellent work, good behaviour, kindness, politeness and courtesy to others. When children achieve 25 merits they receive a certificate and badge in assembly and at 50 merits they receive a certificate and have a dip in the Treasure Chest. Upon receiving 75 merits, children are awarded a voucher.

Uniform and Appearance

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform when travelling to and from school and whilst on the premises. They should take pride in their appearance and always aim to look clean and tidy. Jewellery is not permitted, including earrings.

Long hair should be tied up with a plain black, white or maroon hair bobble/band. We do not allow make-up, which includes nail varnish. Children are expected to wear black school shoes and not boots or trainers.

All clothing and equipment must be clearly named, with coats having a strong loop for hanging. P.E attire must be brought in a cloth bag with a loop to hang on a peg. Swimming kit is needed in a separate bag (when applicable).

Admissions Policy

We have an Admissions Policy for our Nursery and Academy. The published admission number for the Reception Class is 45 and your child will be due to start school in the September following their fourth birthday.

Application forms for Kentmere Nursery are available from our office. Applications to Reception are made online via the school admissions team via Rochdale.gov.uk/schooladmissions.

Places in primary schools are allocated by the Admission Authority up to the school admission limit using the following priority order:

- Child in care to the Local Authority
- Children with exceptional medical needs or exceptional welfare considerations (supporting information needed)
- Sibling already in school
- Children eligible for Service Premium
- Children of staff within the school
- Children who have attended Kentmere Nursery
- Proximity and ease of access.
